


Mid-America MHTTC: Munroe-Meyer Institute's Training in Integrated Care

OVERVIEW




The Mid-America Mental Health Technology Transfer Center (MHTTC), based at the Munroe-Meyer Institute at the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) in Omaha, is tasked by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) with improving access to care and building the workforce of behavioral health (BH) professionals. Our approach coincides with a national movement toward the integration of behavioral health into primary care medical practices, creating a “medical home” for patients in which their physical and behavioral health needs can be collaboratively addressed.

Benefits of integration include:

- Improved access to care
- Higher levels of patient satisfaction
- Increased cost effectiveness
- Reductions in stigma that have traditionally been associated with seeking BH care

The Mid-America MHTTC provides training, technical assistance, and consultation in the implementation of pediatric integrated primary care practice to increase access to care and develop the behavioral health workforce.
